# PERSONAL TAX

# P1181 Personal tax round up (19.20 minutes)

Dean Wootten takes a look at the impact of the new NIC thresholds for 2020/21, recaps on the agency rules and considers a number of recent capital tax decisions heard by the First Tier Tribunal.

#### P1182 Saving for a pension – Part 1 (17.22 minutes)

Robert Jamieson uses this seminar on pensions to consider the interaction of pension arrangements with National Insurance as well as the difference between 'Relief at source' and 'Net pay' pension schemes. These are both areas where we could see change in the March Budget.
